Almond Board appoints new Chairman

The Almond Board of Australia (ABA) recently elected Brenton Woolston, general manager of Almondco Australia as new chairman.

Mr Woolston takes over from John Bird of Select Harvests, who held the position since August last year.

Mr Woolston also holds the position of president of the Australian Nut Industry Council (ANIC).

Brenton was appointed to Almondco to fill the role of marketing manager in 2001 and was promoted to group general manager just over a year later.

He has managed a period of significant growth and success in Almondco's long history and is a strong advocate for promoting Australian almonds as a premium product on the world market.

Mr Woolston said he was looking forward to building on the good foundation established to date and working with the ABA management team.
