Almond Board of Australia appoints new CEO

The Almond Board of Australia (ABA) has announced the appointment of Ross Skinner as its new CEO from 22 November. The announcement was made at the annual almond conference held in Mildura (Vic) from 27-29 October.

Mr Skinner has worked in the horticulture industry for 26 years and has qualifications in economics and accounting.
